Today is Native Women's Equal Pay Day, representing how far into 2022 Native and Indigenous women have to work to earn what a white man did in 2021. All women experience a pay gap, but many women of color face much wider gaps. The next—and last—equal pay day of 2022 is Latina Equal Pay Day on December 8th. Latinas face one of the widest pay disparities of any group of women—earning on average just 54 cents for every dollar a white man earns, when looking at both full- and part-time workers.

Join us in person in downtown Chicago on Thursday, December 8th for <u>Empowerment</u>, <u>Progress</u>, and <u>Determination</u>: <u>Advocating for Accountability</u>—an event in solidarity with Latina Equal Pay Day and economic justice for all women all year round.

Equal Pay Day Chicago's first in-person event in 3 years will feature a conversation with Latina leaders from across Chicago and Illinois on how we can advocate for accountability and work towards change. We'll follow with a reception honoring coalition founder and Chicago Branch member Barb Yong and celebrating her upcoming retirement. Thanks to all of you that notified folks in suburbia, sent cards, or shared our concerns that the Illinois Supreme could have become an anti-abortion court. Because of everyone's work, Illinois now has 2 more pro-choice Supreme Court justices. Thanks!!

Please ask your representatives to co-sponsor House Joint Resolution 94! This resolution supports the passing of the ERA in D.C.

Conversations are in progress to possibly make healthy, sexual education that is age appropriate and medically correct mandatory before the 2023 session. When we have a bill number, we will let you know.

AAUW Public Policy co-chairs are working on a statewide coalition to deal with the number of folks who want to ban books, eliminate understanding of gender change, eliminating healthy and sexual education and encouraging the white washing of U. S. History. Elected school boards are in suburbia and downstate. Please make a list of your friends, family and others who live outside of Chicago in Illinois. School board elections are next spring and we have lots of work to maintain a strong public education.
