The National Museum of Mexican Art will present a guided private tour with docent for Día de Muertos, Where the Past is Present, dedicated to Ray Patlán (1946-2024), a Chicago muralist and painter who died this spring. The 38th annual exhibition commemorates the celebration of our departed loved ones through beautiful ofrendas. Nearly seventy works from the Museum's Permanent Collection, mostly arte popular, are part of this exhibition, which reveals the importance of collective feeling through the creative hands of different generations of popular artists. Art reflects society, and with this celebration, all those who have died from violence are remembered in this exhibition.

Research – Action – Impact: Leveraging Data to Close the Wage Gap for Latinas

Chicago branch of AAUW is part of the Chicago Equal Pay Day Coalition. We cosponsored the October 3rd Latina Equal Pay Day Event. If you were not able to participate live in the webinar, I encourage you to watch the recording via You Tube. On Oct 3, (Latina Equal Pay Day), the Equal Pay Chicago Coalition (EPCC), hosted a powerful virtual event in collaboration with Mujeres Latinas en Acción, the Institute for Women's Policy Research (IWPR), Women Employed, and Chicago Federation of Labor.

Latinas are disproportionately represented in underpaid industries and often lack basic workplace protections. Farmworkers, domestic workers, and immigrant women, in particular, face exclusions from essential employment safeguards, leaving them vulnerable to wage theft, sexual harassment, and exploitation. Until these vital workers achieve economic security, our communities and economy will not thrive to their full potential.
