Tiffany's vast artistic vision and bring lighting designs to life, artisans at the Studios used a range of materials-- including bronze, enamel, pottery, and glass. Tiffany Lamps: Beyond the Shade explores this exciting aspect of Tiffany Studios' history and encourages visitors to see Tiffany's beloved lamps in a new light. There is an audio tour that is free to use

throughout the galleries. There will be docents on every floor to help with any questions.

The Driehaus Museum engages and inspires the global community through exploration and ongoing conversations in art, architecture, and design of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

Our Panel of Speakers:

Isabel McMullen, PhD candidate in Political Science at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and an Institute of Education Sciences pre-doctoral fellow, will discuss the recent politicization of leadership in higher education, share key examples of governing board in/action, and show recent research and data that helps contextualize the current debates. Her research explores the relationship between government and educational institutions, in particular how state politics influence higher ed and the dynamics of public university governing boards. She also conducts program evaluations on college-access programs, and studies the decisions that lead to education policy at the state level.

Meghan Kissell is the Senior Director of Policy and Member Advocacy at AAUW, leading federal policy and grassroots advocacy efforts. With 20+ years in public policy, she has worked on gender equity, LGBTQ rights, public health, and conservation. Previously, she led campaigns protecting public lands in the Western United States and expanding LGBTQ rights in the Deep South. Meghan holds a master's in social work from Howard University and a bachelor's in political science from Allegheny College. Passionate about activism, she helps AAUW members turn frustration into action, ensuring their voices shape policies that advance equity and opportunity.

Dr. Ken Olson currently serves on the AAUW-IL board as Co-Director of Public Policy and on the Schaumburg Area branch board as Policy Director. He is Principal of KEO Consulting, working in dairy and research policy. A native of Wisconsin, he has a PhD in Dairy Cattle Breeding (Genetics) from UW-Madison, was a professor on the faculty of the Animal Science Department at the University of Kentucky, and then the national Dairy and Animal Health Specialist for the American Farm Bureau Federation.
