We will have recent local AAUW Fellows and Grantees speak to us about their research and programs. For the 2025–2026 academic year, AAUW is investing over \$5.3 million to support 228 women scholars and community projects. These grants and fellowships are lifelines — especially for women of color and those in STEM fields who continue to face systemic barriers.

Since 1888, AAUW has been one of the largest funders of women's graduate education, investing in women who go on to change the world. Between FY2020-2025, AAUW awarded nearly \$29.6 million in total (this includes multiple award types and organizational grants) to about 1,538 women and community projects. By 2023, more than \$135 million had been awarded in total since program inception (in 1888) to over 13,000 women and nonprofit orgs.

Types of grants American Fellowships: these support U.S. citizens / permanent residents in doctoral / post-doc / publication phases. International Fellowships: for women from outside the U.S. studying in the U.S. at master's, professional, or doctoral level. Career Development Grants: to support certifications, credentials, second-degrees, re-entry into workforce. Selected Professions Fellowships: aimed at fields in which women are underrepresented. Community Action Grants / International Project Grants: for community or international projects that further AAUW's mission
